The current budget is around \$64 billion dollars. State projections are that the state will have about \$70 billion in revenue over the next budget year. In your opinion, what should be done with the additional \$6 billion dollars?

- To fund these programs, voters would be asked to approve a referendum to raise the state's debt limit to allow for the issuing of \$4 billion dollars in bonds. The bonds would not raise taxes although they could possibly mean increased taxes in the future.
- There are many details, of course, but from what you understand of this proposal, would you be inclined to favor or oppose raising the state's debt limit to allow the sale of bonds to cover the cost of these projects? Would you say you are:
